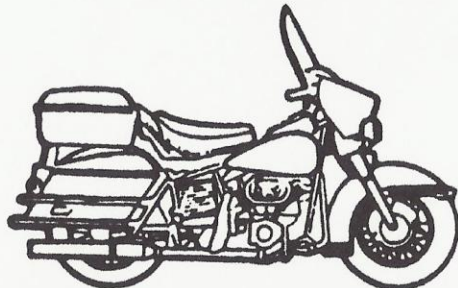


MICHIGAN DRESSERS M/C 23rd ANNUAL TOYS FOR KIDS MOTORCYCLE RALLY

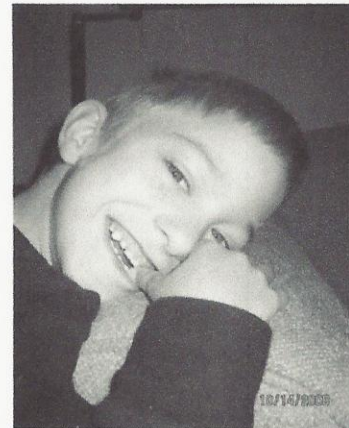

KADEN STREK

2010 MICHIGAN DRESSERS M/C SPONSORED CHILD



Kaden is a 7 year old boy who was born 3 months early under extremely sad and difficult circumstances. He died twice the day of his birth but fought back. His tiny 2 ½ pound body was left extremely damaged and his prognosis was grim. Although he is not the "vegetable" that doctors predicted, his handicaps are extremely severe:

LEGALLY BLIND: due to Optic Nerve Hypoplasia (an underdeveloped optic nerve which interferes with transmission of visual signals to his brain) with Nystagmus and Strabismus (involuntary eye movements).

SPASTIC DIPELEGIC CEREBRAL PALSY: Inability to walk independently - limited to a walker for short distances and a wheelchair for distance.

HYDROCEPHALUS: excess spinal fluid or "water on the brain", requiring the use of a shunt. **DEVELOPMENTAL APRAXIA OF SPEECH:** very limited ability for speech (about 10 words).

Quick Facts about Kaden: Adopted as a newborn by Tom and Elisabeth ("Eddie") Strek, he has two sisters, Hailey, also age 6 and Teagan, age 2. Hospitalized for 25 weeks in just his first two years of life, undergoing 15 major surgeries, including his brain, heart and abdomen. He has had 29 therapists; current weekly therapy regime includes: Physical, Occupational, Vision, Speech, Swimming, Orientation and Mobility. Formerly a student at Penrickton Center for Blind Children. Currently attending Keith Bovenschen School for Special Needs Children.

Kaden is in need of expensive treatments and therapy programs not covered by insurance. Our primary goal is to raise funds to get Kaden to China for Umbilical Cord Blood Stem Cell Treatments. These treatments are not available in the United States and could dramatically impact his quality of life. Stem cell therapy treatments are permanent improvements and could allow Kaden to SEE, WALK and SPEAK. Additional goals are to fund therapy services and equipment not covered by insurance.
